



CEDAR RAPIDS AND IOWA CITY WALLEYE CLUB 2022 SEASON REPORT

The Cedar Rapids and Iowa City Walleye Club completed their 2nd full season of events after a COVID shortened 2020 season. The “CRANDIC” Club has over 40 members this year. The Club conducted monthly meetings, participated in 3 tournaments and had 1 weather cancellation for the 2022 season. The Club also conducted a June fisheriee at Pleasant Creek State Recreation Area for Camp Courageous (local camp for disabled youth) in cooperation with NRG Media radio stations: 105.7; 107.9 and 1540AM. Club members also conducted an August youth event in cooperation with the local Boys & Girls Clubs of the Corridor at the Fish-O-Rama derby on Robins Lake in Cedar Rapids.

Lake McBride-May 1st. CRANDIC Clubbers started their season on the club's home lake after being blown out of another planned kick-off event at Pleasant Creek. Members Ethan Trimble, Matt and Mike Troendle were the winners with the team of Nichols and Hora in 2nd. This was the club's 1st attempt at using a phone app to score an event and was met with mixed reaction from the anglers.





Mississippi River-Pool 10 June 12th. The Mississippi River continues to show itself as the finest walleye fishing location in our region regardless of the Pool or time of year. The husband/wife team of Chris and Cindy Staebell won a slugfest by just a ½ inch over the Second Place team of Trumblee/Troendle/Troendle. Big Fish went to Tim Dougherty/Tom Weed for their 28" winner. We tested the Fish Donkey app for scoring and it seemed to work well for the anglers but required a lot of administrative time.





Mississippi River-Pool 13. October 8 & 9: The final event of the season was another CPR event with over 40 fish caught by 6 teams in 2 days. Winners were the team of Trumblee/Troendle/Troendle. The winners fished near the auxiliary lock and weighed a limit of fish for both days totalling 220 inches for a 22" per fish average. In 2nd place, Chris Staebell weighed 7 fish for 156" and got the tourney's big fish at 25" off a wing dam while casting crankbaits.





The CRANDIC Walleye Club has a 5 event 2023 tourney schedule in place and will start the year with the Club's Annual Membership Meeting and Steak Fry in January. The Club will also participate in several sports shows in and around eastern Iowa this winter.
